Mark 10:35-45

³⁵ Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to him. "Teacher," they said, "we want you to do for us whatever we ask."

³⁶ "What do you want me to do for you?" he asked.

³⁷ They replied, "Let one of us sit at your right and the other at your left in your glory."

³⁸ "You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said. "Can you drink the cup I drink or be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with?"

³⁹ "We can," they answered.

Jesus said to them, "You will drink the cup I drink and be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with, 40 but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared."

⁴¹ When the ten heard about this, they became indignant with James and John. ⁴² Jesus called them together and said, "You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. ⁴³ Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴ and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. ⁴⁵ For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Dissecting the Conversation

The Characters

James and John, the Sons of Thunder

Their mommy (parallel passage in Matthew 20:20-28)

Jesus, the serving Savior

Note the subtle manipulation (verse 35)

Application: Jesus doesn't make <u>deals</u>; Jesus makes <u>disciples</u>.

Note the arrogance in their answer even after Jesus questions their motive (verse 38)

Application: Most of us vastly overestimate our value to God's kingdom in the <u>short term</u> and vastly underestimate our value to God's kingdom in the <u>long term</u>.

Note that Jesus' answer is no (verse 40)

Application: The most telling sign of your <u>maturity</u> is how you respond to a no.

Jesus paints a new picture of leadership with the words, "Not so with you" (verse 43)

Application: Greatness isn't about elevating <u>yourself</u>, it's about elevating <u>Jesus</u>.

Jesus introduces another of the "divine opposites" (verses 43-44)

Application: Greatness is not about status, title or wealth; it's about <u>service</u>.

Jesus reinforces and restates his mission and his invitation (verse 45)

Application: Jesus <u>came to serve</u>, and he calls us to the same mission.
