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This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. 1 John 4:10 (NIV)

Sacrament = An outward and visible sign of inward and spiritual divine grace.

Water baptism identifies the believer's union with the death and resurrection of Jesus. Communion is an active remembering of the death of Jesus until he returns. These ordinances are actively celebrated today but they are not a means of salvation. CTK Belief #7

**bap-tism** (bap'tiz'əm) = "immerse, dip, saturate, overwhelm or submerge into water."

Baptism is the outward physical expression of the inward spiritual regeneration of our souls.

 $\Rightarrow$  Jesus did it.
