Love Rules

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Q—Have you ever tried to earn someone's love?

Then some Pharisees and teachers of the law came to Jesus from Jerusalem and

asked, "Why do your disciples break the tradition of the elders? They don't wash their hands before they eat!" Matthew 15:1–2 (NIV)

Jesus replied, "And why do you break the command of God for the sake of your tradition? For God said, 'Honor your father and mother' and 'Anyone who curses their father or mother is to be put to death.' But you say that if anyone declares that what might have been used to help their father or mother is 'devoted to God,' they are not to 'honor their father or mother' with it. Thus you nullify the word of God for the sake of your tradition."

Matthew 15:3–6 (NIV)

"Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them." Matthew 5:17 (NIV)

One of them, an expert in the law, tested him with this question: "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied: 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.'

This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." Matthew 22:35–40 (NIV)

They worship me in vain; their teachings are merely human rules.'" Matthew 15:7–9 (NIV) "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. - How does our love fulfill all the commandments?
- Why do you think love is the greatest identifier to show that we are his followers?
- How can we let love be our rule in a lost, love-starved world that now judges us because of the history of the church being judgmental?
