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An Unusual Worship Service

Mark 5:1-15 NEW KING JAMES VERSION (NKJV)

Then they came to the other side of the sea, to the country of the Gadarenes. ² And when He [Jesus] had come out of the boat, immediately there met Him out of the tombs a man with an unclean spirit, ³ who had his dwelling among the tombs; and no one could bind him, not even with chains, ⁴ because he had often been bound with shackles and chains. And the chains had been pulled apart by him, and the shackles broken in pieces; neither could anyone tame him. ⁵ And always, night and day, he was in the mountains and in the tombs, crying out and cutting himself with stones.

⁶ When he saw Jesus from afar, he ran and worshiped Him. ⁷ And he cried out with a loud voice and said, "What have I to do with You, Jesus, Son of the Most High God?" I implore You by God that You do not torment me."

⁸ For He said to him, "Come out of the man, unclean spirit!" ⁹ Then He

asked him, "What is your name?"

And he answered, saying, "My name is Legion; for we are many."

¹⁰ Also he begged Him earnestly that He would not send them out of the country.

¹¹ Now a large herd of swine was feeding there near the mountains.

¹² So all the demons begged Him, saying, "Send us to the swine, that we may enter them." ¹³ And at once Jesus gave them permission. Then the unclean spirits went out and entered the swine (there were about two thousand); and the herd ran violently down the steep place into the sea and drowned in the sea.

¹⁴ So those who fed the swine fled, and they told it in the city and in the country. And they went out to see what it was that had happened.

¹⁵ Then they came to Jesus and saw the one who had been demon-possessed and had the legion, sitting and clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid.

My own definition of worship:

Stretching to touch the feet of God and finding out
that he allows you to touch his face instead

Biblical Words for Worship

Hebrew: *shachah* — to kiss toward

Greek: *proskuneo* — to prostrate yourself before God

Lying flat on the ground, face downward in reverence or submission

A Posture of Worship

yadah (ya-*daw*)

- **Praise** — to extend the hands, or to throw out of the hands
- An **active** posture of excitement and enthusiasm for God in praise and worship

All your works praise (*yadah*) you, Lord;
Your faithful people extol you. – Psalm 145:10

May the peoples praise (*yadah*) you, God;
May all the peoples praise (*yadah*) you. – Psalm 67:3

In God we make our boast all day long,
And we will praise (*yadah*) your name forever. – Psalm 44:8

In worship, hands are raised...

In celebration

In dependence

In surrender

In preparation

In worship

Next Step
