1 Corinthians 15:1-4

Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. ² By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. ³ For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, ⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures...

The message of Jesus is:

Continual - "I want to remind you"

Proclamational - "I preached to you"

Personal - "you received"

Eternal - "By this gospel you are saved"

Central - "I passed on to you as of first importance"

Christological - "that Christ died"

Substitutional - Christ died for our sins"

Transformational - "raised again on the third day"

Key Principle

What we have <u>received</u> we are to <u>pass on</u> to other people. "For what I received, I passed on to you..."

Matthew 1:18-23

¹⁸ This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

²⁰ But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." *(continues on back)*

²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: ²³ "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us").

Not one name, but two: Yeshua

<u>Immanuel</u>

The First Mention of Immanuel:

Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel. - Isaiah 7:14

The context of this verse is Isaiah 7, and the chapter is not about "the most wonderful time of the year." It's a <u>judgment</u> oracle against Israel for their idolatry and faithlessness.

Meaning of the Names

Immanuel - <u>God with us</u> Yeshua (Jesus) - God saves

Application of the Names

Because *God saves* and *God is with us,* our fitting response should be to regift both the presence and the salvation of Jesus to everyone.
