An often forgotten fact:

Jesus' followers established the first church while Herod, Pilate and Caiaphas were still ruling in Jerusalem.

Highlights of Acts 1-2 and Pentecost

- The Holy Spirit comes
- The apostles speak in languages they don't previously know
- Peter preaches a simple gospel:

²² "Fellow Israelites, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know. ²³ This man was handed over to you by God's deliberate plan and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. ²⁴ But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him. – Acts 2:22-24

People are saved:

³⁷ When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?"

³⁸ Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. – Acts 2:37-38

The Church is Formed in the Middle of Survival Mode

⁴² They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. ⁴³ Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. ⁴⁴ All the believers were together and had everything in common. ⁴⁵ They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. ⁴⁶ Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved. - Acts 2:42-47

Though they were in survival mode...

They didn't rely on <u>earthly</u> wisdom;

they grounded themselves in godly wisdom (vs. 42)

They didn't <u>pull away</u>; they <u>pressed in</u> (vs. 42)

They didn't eat <u>alone</u>; they ate <u>together</u> (vs. 42)

They didn't pout; they prayed (vs. 42)

They developed a sense of <u>awe</u>, not a sense of <u>doubt</u> (vs. 43)

They didn't focus on their own needs; they met others' needs (vs. 44-45)

They didn't <u>isolate</u>; they gathered (vs. 46)

They didn't give up; they gave thanks (vs. 46)

They didn't focus in; they focused out (vs. 47)
