Small Group Conversation Guide

Enjoying Life / Ecclesiastes 2

Warm-up: Is there anything you are a *connoisseur* of? Or put another way, is there anything you *nerd out* on? What is it and why do you enjoy it?

Read: Ecclesiastes 2:1-26 (it's long....take turns!)

Here Solomon shares his journey to enjoy life through pleasure and work. He comes up empty. He concludes that anything we enjoy must come from God. (v.24-26)

- 1. Solomon makes a decision to pursue pleasure, and yet this is still vanity (breath or hevel in Hebrew). Why can't seeking pleasure be the focus of our life?
- 2. What things does Solomon pursue to bring enjoyment to his life? How does it resonate with things our culture pursues? Does it help reinforce the idea that 'there's nothing new under the sun' from chapter one?
- 3. Why is it especially challenging NOT to pursue pleasure in our culture?
- 4. Why doesn't Solomon find fulfillment in any of his great projects? (verses 18-23) How does this relate to your world?
- 5. Solomon concludes that apart from God we can't find enjoyment. (v.25) Why is this true?
- 6. What does God give to the one who pleases Him? (v.26)
- 7. How can we find joy in making our life about pleasing God?
- 8. How can receiving blessings as a gift from God more enjoyable than chasing those blessings on our own? What's the difference?
- 9. Is this passage comforting or challenging to you? Why?

Prayer: How can we pray for each other this week?
