Jesus Confronts the Taboo Topic of Divorce in Matthew 19:1-9

¹When Jesus had finished saying these things, he left Galilee and went into the region of Judea to the other side of the Jordan. ²Large crowds followed him, and he healed them there.

³Some Pharisees came to him to test him. They asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for any and every reason?"

Context for the question: Dueling rabbis and personal justification

The original marriage vow included fidelity, provision and love.

⁴ "Haven't you read," he replied, "that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female," ⁵ and said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh"? ⁶ So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate."

Jesus begins with a foundational truth: Marriage is sacred

Jesus understands a foundational reality: Marriage is hard

⁷ "Why then," they asked, "did Moses command that a man give his wife a certificate of divorce and send her away?"

⁸ Jesus replied, "Moses permitted you to divorce your wives because your hearts were hard. But it was not this way from the beginning. ⁹I tell you that anyone who divorces his wife, except for sexual immorality, and marries another woman commits adultery."

Worth noting: <u>Permission</u> and <u>command</u> are not the same.
