The Beginning of the Story

Many have undertaken to draw up an account of the things that have been fulfilled among us, ² just as they were handed down to us by those who from the first were eyewitnesses and servants of the word. ³ With this in mind, since I myself have carefully investigated everything from the beginning, I too decided to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, ⁴ so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught. – **Luke 1:1-4**

Worth repeating (verse 1)

<u>Credible</u> — based on eyewitness accounts (verse 2)

Reliable (verse 3)

The confident foundation on which the <u>heart of God</u> is revealed ($verses\ 3-4$)...

God is for you

He is coming after you

Tell Me the Story Again

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. ²(This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) ³ And everyone went to their own town to register.

⁴So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. ⁵He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. – Luke 2:1-5

God gave us a promise: Therefore, the Lord himself will give you sign: The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son and will call him Immanuel. – Isaiah 7:14
